



Wakefield and Acton school students participated in our **Wonders of Water activities**. This was the pilot year of **Trout in the Classroom** for the Paul School 4th grades.



A collaborative **BioBlitz** is helping Province Lake Golf Course become a certified Audubon International Cooperative Sanctuary. Students and community members explored the fields, forests, and ponds to identify and map plant and animal species.



Our **Youth Conservation Corps** completed 18 projects across 6 waterbodies. We hired 2 crew leaders and 6 crew members, local teens who now have an enhanced appreciation for our lakes.



PROTECT

A 100' long by 10' vegetated buffer was installed on the Province Lake beach adjacent to Route 153 to mitigate the effects of road runoff to the lake.
